Getting involved with your local CHSWG



What's a CHSWG?

Children's Hearing Services Working Groups (CHSWGs) ensure that the services for deaf children and their families in your area work together to provide the best support possible. They are based in health authority areas in England.

Who sits on CHSWGs?

Parents of deaf children, as well as any other service users, and professionals who provide services for deaf children, such as teachers of the deaf, audiologists, and speech and language therapists. NDCS also tries to attend many CHSWG meetings.

Why should I get involved?

This is a chance to have a direct impact on your local services and how they work for you, your children and family, and the children and families of your local group. Have your say and shape the services deaf children in your area receive.

What skills or experience do I need?

You don't need any experience to attend; all you need to be able to do is give your opinion about the services for deaf children in your area. Ideally these will be based on your own experiences as well as the experiences of other families in your group.

How much time do I need to give?

A few hours every term is normal. Different CHSWGs meet on different days at different times; some of them do meet during the day so if you work full-time, you may not be able to attend. You can find out when and where your local CHSWG meets by asking your Teacher of the Deaf, the NDCS Regional Director for your area or by contacting the helpline.
